payment prior to enrolment and standard terms and conditions in the participant information
states 'all bookings must be confirmed with payment in full and cleared, at least 10 working days
prior to the commencement of the course'.

- The organisation's documented training and assessment strategy contains unclear information regarding the amount of training to be provided to the target student cohort. For example, but not limited to:
 - There is no information in the strategy document that clearly identifies the amount time the student will need to commit to the course apart from the 5 days face to face or 650 hours over a duration of between 7 to 12 months.
- The organisation's documented training and assessment strategy does not separate training from assessment; therefore, it cannot be confirmed what the actual amount of training which meet the requirements of Clause 1.1 and 1.2.

This was an auditor error because upon review it was found that the TAS contained a very detailed table which covered the above.

- reflecting the learner's needs;

 the individual

Validity

Any assessment decision of the RTO is justified, based on the evidence of performance of the individual learner.

Validity requires:

- assessment against the unit/s of competency and the associated assessment requirements covers the broad range of skills and knowledge that are essential to competent performance;
- assessment of knowledge and skills is integrated with their practical application;
- assessment to be based on evidence that demonstrates that a learner could demonstrate these skills and knowledge in other similar situations; and
- judgement of competence is based on evidence of learner performance that is aligned to the unit/s of competency and associated assessment requirements.

Reliability Evidence presented for assessment is consistently interpreted and assessment results

are comparable irrespective of the assessor conducting the assessment.

Review of the organisation's operations confirmed that it has entered into third party arrangements without ensuring that each arrangement is subject to a written agreement. For example, but not limited to:

Systemic issues

On 8 August 2019, the RTO was requested to provide evidence of monitoring of third parties for a 12 month period from May 2018 to May 2019.

The organisation provided a document - Schedules of Standards Compliance Document that states under the heading for Clause 2.4 Allowed variances and states 'Partners who are RTOs self-audit against the requirements of the TAE and report back to HBTA. Non-RTOs and new partners are regularly desk audited more frequently with the assistance of long time senior trainers who provide mentoring if required.'

This approach along with the adhoc nature of evidence provided demonstrates the organisation does not have mechanisms that ensure the systematic monitoring of third parties it has arrangements with.

This is because a number of the files were in other than the CEOs computer and the time allowed (2 hours) was not sufficient to check every individual staff Drop Box and Collate them. Also, the auditor deemed that we did not have a systematic monitoring of third parties because that evidence was not asked for.

The RTO ensures that any third party delivering services on its behalf is required under written agreement to cooperate with the VET Regulator:

- b) in the conduct of audits and the monitoring of its operations.

The following evidence was reviewed:

 The Third Party Agreements/Memorandum of Understanding listed below are a sampled selection of agreements and do not represent the entire number of third party agreements held by the organisation.



- Review of the organisation's written agreement for services delivered on its behalf found that it does
 contain conditions which ensure that the third party meets all relevant obligations in the delivery of
 these services. For example, but not limited to:
 - The third party agreements contain references such as 'All parties shall be compliant with all legislative and regulatory standards, including ASQA directives and Standards for RTOs, 2016 (as amended July 2017) as published for compliance with the National Vocational Education and Training Regulation Act or as directed by their State Training Authority.'
- However, the organisation has not demonstrated that it ensures its written agreements include a clause requiring that third parties co-operate with ASQA in:
 - Providing accurate and factual responses to information requests from ASQA
 - The conduct of audits and the monitoring of its operations.

Compliance with legislation

Standards for RTOs Clause 8.5

Original Finding: Not compliant

Finding following additional evidence: Compliant

The RTO complies with Commonwealth, State and Territory legislation and regulatory requirements relevant to its operations.

The following was reviewed in relation to compliance with legislative and regulatory requirements relevant to the RTO's operations:

· Information and evidence as detailed throughout this report

The RTOs practices are not compliant with the requirements of Clause 8.5 of the *Standards for RTOs 2015* as it has not complied with Commonwealth legislation and regulatory requirements relevant to its operations; specifically:

Failure to notify ASQA of a material change or event can constitute a breach of the <u>National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011</u>. The RTO has not provided notification to ASQA of the commencement of offshore delivery as evidenced in the Training partner list 2018-2019 which makes reference to the approval of delivery overseas to industry clients in their home countries.

There was no breach because ASQA had been notified of the material change in May 2018.

<u>Analysis of additional evidence</u>
The RTOs practices are compliant with the requirements of Clause 8.5 of the *Standards for RTOs* 2015 as it has complied with Commonwealth legislation and regulatory requirements relevant to its operations.

This was followed by a list of third parties which was not accurate and most subsequently cancelled due to the ASQA directive.

It has been erased as no longer relevant at the time this report was written.
