What does the program involve?

You will work closely with a Career Advisor on your work experience, strengths and preferences, and undertake individually tailored assessments to identify career and skilling options to develop a personalised Career Plan, including:

- Skills you can develop to get a new job or new career;
- Skills you could enhance to increase your ability to perform in your current role;
- Advice and recommendations about skills and training options.

Eligible participants may access up to \$2,200 (GST inclusive) as a co-contribution from the Australian Government to fund re-skilling or up-skilling opportunities.
