- Train adults so they actually get it.
- Write and deliver training sessions that work in the real world.
- Assess skills fairly and to industry standards.
- Keep your training compliant with national requirements.

DID YOU KNOW? You can commence working at an RTO under supervision - so, **your transition to a trainer can begin immediately!** We have Registered Training Organisations begging us for skilled tradespeople, and we are happy to introduce you to ones that are looking for trainers NOW!

“Do I need computer skills?”


Basic digital skills help, but if you are not confident, we can show you what you need.

After 25 years on the tools, Dave wanted more time with his family and less time climbing ladders. He completed his TAE40122 while still working full-time, using weekends to study. Six months later, he was working three days a week as a TAFE trainer, earning more than he did full-time and with every Friday off.

Mel, Carpenter to Workplace Trainer

Mel loved building but wanted to be more involved in mentoring apprentices. Her boss supported her to work under supervision while she completed her TAE. Now, she runs all the apprentice induction and safety training for her company.

Sam, Diesel Mechanic to RTO Assessor

Sam's back could not keep up with workshop work, but he still loved the industry. With the TAE, he moved into assessing heavy vehicle apprentices across regional Queensland. He is still "in the game" but now spends more time travelling and meeting people than wrenching.

When Fully Qualified: Your First Week as a Trainer - What It May Look Like

Monday - Meet students, run an induction session, and set up their training plans.

Tuesday - Deliver practical training in the workshop, guiding students through tasks you could almost do in your sleep.

Wednesday - Mark assessments and give feedback to learners.

Thursday - Update training resources, check compliance requirements.

Friday - Maybe deliver an online session or maybe finish early, because you can. It is still hands-on.
